KEYNOTE SPEAKER WADE OWLETT INSPIRES RISING EDUCATORS AT VIRTUAL CONFERENCE

Educators Rising, the premier national career and technical education program for aspiring educators, held its annual national conference virtually in June. More than 1,200 future and current educators attended to connect and learn about their chosen profession, and, of those, more than 750 students showcased their teaching skills in national competitions.

Students were especially enthusiastic about the Saturday keynote

speaker, Wade Owlett, the 2018-19 National Rural Educator of the Year. He opened with a story of how his own childhood trauma motivated him to become a teacher: "When I was about 8 years old, I was struggling in school. I had convinced myself and apparently my teachers that I was unworthy of help. But when I moved schools, Mrs. Mickey didn't see a broken boy. She gave me hope when I couldn't find it myself. And I believe Mrs. Mickey saved my life." Owlett went on to describe how the best teachers craft shared experiences with students, cultivate an environment that is safe for everyone, and bring value into the world beyond the classroom.

One Ed Rising student reflected, "Wade's story is a prime example of how teachers can create an everlasting impact on students and eventually build them into the leaders they are today. This is what education is all about!"

As we look back on our 2021 conference, we're already gearing up to make next year's in-person event bigger and better! Jo Ann Fujioka 1939-2021

Former PDK International president (2006-2008) Jo Ann Fujioka passed away on July 6, 2021. During World War II, she was interned, along with her family and more than 100,000 other Japanese Americans, in the Poston, Arizona, internment camp. This experience inspired her to become a champion for diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Jo Ann was passionate about education and educators. For more than 20 years, she worked in the Jefferson County School District (Colorado) as the central area manager for special education and related services. Besides serving as PDK president, she was also director of the National PTA and president of the Denver PTA. Throughout her life, she remained dedicated to public service, advocacy for the education of children, and serving her country, her state, and national and local educational organizations. PDK is grateful for her life of service.
