FOUNDATION BOARD CHAIR NAMED 2022 MISSOURI SUPERINTENDENT OF THE YEAR

Curtis Cain, chair of the PDK Educational Foundation Board, was named the 2022 Missouri Superintendent of the Year by the Missouri Association of School Administrators (MASA).

Prior to leading the PDK Education Foundation Board, Cain served with distinction as the chair of the PDK International Board of Directors. His teaching experience spans grades 7 through the university level, with an

emphasis on the social sciences, performance evaluation, and issues related to disparity and diversity. He is currently the superintendent of schools in the Wentzville School District, where he is responsible for the educational performance and well-being of close to 16,000 students and the productivity of 2,200 staff members in the fastest-growing district in Missouri. A champion for his community who has strived to be a leader throughout his career, Cain is a former member of the PDK Emerging Leader program and now serves on the Missouri Commissioner of Education Advisory Council, the Kansas/ Missouri Superintendent Leadership Forum Advisory Board, and the Missouri Association of School Administrators Executive Board.

Cain will be recognized during the American Association of School Administrators National Conference in February 2022.
