EDUCATORS RISING ALUM INSPIRES STUDENTS AT CONFERENCE

Tamir Harper is a self-described advocate for equal and quality education in urban schools, as well as an alum of the Educators Rising program. During the 2017-18 school year, when he was a senior at the Science Leadership Academy in Philadelphia, Harper served as Educators Rising national vice president. Now, after graduating from American University in May, he will realize his dream of becoming a lead teacher in Philadelphia for the 2022-23 school year. During his journey to the classroom, he was named a Frederick Douglas Distinguished Scholar and was the 61st eastern regional vice president of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated. He also has delivered several speeches sharing his inspirational story.

PDK International's Educators Rising program was proud to welcome Harper back as a keynote speaker at the 2022 Educators Rising National Conference in Washington, D.C., on June 26. This year's conference drew almost 1,900 current and future educators. Attendees heard Harper's story of being a first-generation college student and how his own experiences seeing that white students in his high school were taking different classes from students of color shaped his desire to promote equity in education and make sure students have teachers whose backgrounds are similar to their own.

Harper reminded the students listening to his speech that "Each and every one of you will enter a classroom and teach the next Supreme Court justice, the next chief of staff, and the next group of educators, who will carry the torch." His message embodied the conference theme of Shaping the Future.

The next Educators Rising National Conference will take place in Orlando, Florida, June 29 to July 2, 2023.

DISTINGUISHED EDUCATOR SPOTLIGHT

Robert Williams

At 89, Robert T. Williams was nominated for the governor of North Carolina's highest civilian honor: the Order of the Long Leaf Pine for lifetime service to citizens of the Tar Heel state. He has achieved national recognition for his wide-ranging, innovative ideas for addressing the drain of math and science teachers from public education, repeatedly stating, "there's not one single cause, so there needs to be more than one solution."

In the 1980s, the North Carolina legislature created a scholarship program paying the full tuition for students agreeing to teach at least two years of math in North Carolina public schools after graduation. Williams, then president of the North Carolina Association of Teacher Educators, served as the liaison between the state board of education and the colleges administering the program.

Through his work, 40 students have received scholarships since 1991 from the Clarence Poe Endowed Scholarship Fund at North Carolina State University's College of Education and Psychology, where associate dean emeritus Williams served as scholarship committee chairman.
